Agenda

- Finalize Term 4 Reopening Plans
 - New orders from Mayor have not trickled down into specific guidance for schools
 - Revision of 90 minutes in between instead of 2 hours in between AM/PM
 - Janney will be able to clean 4-5 rooms with 75 minutes in between
 - Minimum class size of 7 is needed to open lower grade PM rooms
 - By Grade
 - PK
 - Only changing classes for kids electing to come in person
 - Cannot meet demand
 - K
 - No changes
 - All kids were offered a spot in advisory 3
 - Teachers are offering outdoor afternoon time with teachers for virtual kids only
 - 1st
 - Addition of two more PM classes (draft)
 - No class changes
 - Virtual PM may receive instruction from partner teacher

- 2nd
 - 40 kids are interested in returning, but at most 22 kids can return
 - Either 11 in a PM class, or 22 with one class AM/PM
- 3rd
 - 2 days of half day outdoor for all students who want to attend
 - Some students not interested in IPL, but would consider outdoors
 - No class changes
 - Will likely use bathrooms directly inside the side doors
- 4th
 - 2 teachers from each rotations report each day now
 - Planning for a slight increase with some restrictions easing up
 - Will be able to offer two days of half-day instruction with a teacher for all virtual kids who now want to report
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- 5th
 - 2 half days with a teacher from their rotation for all who want to report

How will the new CDC guidance impact our expansion plans, provided DCPS changes their guidelines?

- Impact on increasing class sizes and lifting class caps
 - Might not significantly change what we can offer, but we will have to wait for DCPS to update their guidelines to see impact
 - Increase of number of cohorts a teacher can interact with (currently 2)
 - This has the potential to impact us the most – teachers can then rotate in the upper grades and Specials can now host classes indoors in the event of inclement weather. This will also free up some outdoor space as well
